

WABASH RISES IN PRINCETON REVIEW RANKINGS

Wabash College continues to rank among the nation's best when it comes to ranking the best institutions for

academics, affordability, and career prospects.

The 186-year-old liberal arts institution was lauded by the *Princeton Review* in its annual college guide, "Colleges That Pay You Back: The 200 Schools That Give You the Best Bang for Your Tuition Buck," ranking in the top 20 nationally in four different categories.

Wabash ranked No. 18 nationally among the Top-50 Colleges That Pay You Back, an improvement of 20 places over the 2017 rankings; No. 2 in America for Best Alumni Network and Top Internship Opportunities; No. 8 in Best Career Services; and No. 19 in the Top Colleges That Pay You Back for Students With No Demonstrated Need.

Wabash scored 119 points to win the team title at Saturday's DePauw Indoor Track and Field Invitational in Greencastle, Indiana. The Little Giants finished ahead of Rose-Hulman in second place with 115 points. The host Tigers took third place out of 14 teams with a score of 97 points.





Four Wabash wrestlers captured individual titles to help the Little Giants take the team championship at Saturday's Mid-States Invitational at Manchester University Saturday. A total of 20 Little Giant competitors earned top-eight places in their respective brackets. Wabash scored 330 points to win the team title. Olivet finished with 194 to place second overall with Adrian College finishing third out of 10 teams with 146 points.
