October 10, 1969 - President Seymour Inauguration

Thaddeus Seymour, who signed our diplomas, was sworn in as President of Wabash. "I want to see Wabash continue to excel as a small, independent, undergraduate, liberal arts college for men. That forthright definition will be the text for my remarks this morning...the convictions of one who believes with all his being that our type of college, that our own College, continues today the special mission of service which motivated its founding; that Wabash will best serve by producing men of balanced judgment, broad knowledge, and good character – 'Scientiae et Virtuti,' know-how and guts." President Thaddeus Seymour Inaugural Address October 10, 1969

I am saddened to report that President Seymour passed away last week.

"Thaddeus led a full and rich life, and Wabash was blessed by his leadership and humor," said Wabash President Gregory Hess. "He navigated the College with wisdom and humor during the Vietnam War era and the economic dislocation in the early 70's. He made us better during times that weren't." A service of remembrance will be held at Knowles Chapel on the Rollins College campus at 2 pm on Nov. 3.

Monday, December 1st, 1969 - 1st Draft Lottery

December 1st was the night of the first draft lottery in the Vietnam era. We all remember that night, I'm sure.
