Update On Our Reunion, September 10-12

The college has set aside September 11 for the 50th reunions for the classes of 1970 and 1971. For the most part, the reunions will be separate.

As class agent, I do not think just one day is sufficient. I am coordinating with the college about what our class will do on Friday and Sunday, but these are events independent of the college. Our class will have a banquet on the evening of Friday, September 10. The time has not been set. We may have a breakfast on Sunday. Later letters will provide updates on the schedule for our class. This scenario is related to Covid disruptions.

The college's tentative plan for September 11 includes a lunch for anyone who registers to attend it. A Chapel Sing will precede the lunch, and class photos will follow it. Other events will be planned for Saturday morning and afternoon.

The Classes of 1970 and 1971 will have a Saturday dinner either together or separately at which the college will honor each classmate with the traditional medallion for men celebrating their 50th reunions. The Class will have an afterglow event that night.

The college will open online registration sometime after July 1.

I am working on a book on the social and educational history of Wabash College, 1967-1971, with a focus on the Class of 1971. The book is about 80 pages already. It should easily exceed 100 pages, not counting the biographies of classmates. These 80 pages consist of footnoted articles plus unfootnoted anecdotes from classmates, wives, and professors.

Orlo and I got a tour of part of the new football stadium. It is spectacular—modern, clean, and intelligently designed. The stadium is not just for football and track. It

contains suites and meeting rooms.

Brent Harris, sports information director, explained the technology of the press box to us, which was especially interesting to Orlo who had been active in Wabash radio as a student.

The new stadium does not have permanent visitors' seats across from the Wabash seats. To my surprise, the removal of the old visitors' seats has created two spectacular views,
