A few weeks ago, I was contacted by a member of the class of 1988, Jotipalo Bhikkhu.

Here's a portion of his email to me:

"I am a Wabash grad, class of 1988, and have been a Buddhist monk for the last 19 years. My father, Don Sperry, used to be the business controller of the college.


Recently I had a memory of seeing a self-immolation at the college when I was a young child. I'd had this memory at times throughout my life but assumed I had imagined it. I asked my mom about it today, and she told me I was sitting in our car, in the parking lot by Center Hall waiting for my Dad, when it happened. I would have been 5 years old at the time.

I started doing some research on-line and was pleased to see the note that Thom Liffick wrote about his recollections of the event, which you posted in a July 2010 class agent letter. Interestingly you comment in that newsletter, "I often wonder if anyone is taking the time to read them (the class agent newsletters)....!" Do you have Thom's address or Wes Allerdice who is mentioned in the letter? Could you check with them, to see if they are willing to correspond with me about that event?"

Imagine having flashbacks of this throughout your life, and wondering if it was fact or fantasy!

He was hoping to get some feedback from some who were Wabash students at the time of the event, as well as my thoughts about having a memorial service to mark its 50th anniversary. One of his neighbors is actually friends with Rex Vice's (the burn victim) sister. I suggested he contact her out of respect for the family. When he contacted her by phone, she asked that we just let the anniversary day pass when it arrives since she and her sister would like the memory to "just fade away".
