What a Year!

By any measure, 2018-2019 is shaping up to be an exceptionally great academic year for Wabash. Here are just a few of the many highlights:

TOP FULBRIGHT FELLOW COLLEGE: Five Wabash students received Fulbright English Teaching Assistant awards for 2018-19. Wabash students are studying and teaching in Germany, Mexico and Paraguay. This number, combined with other and recent Fellowships, places Wabash among the 40 top Fulbright-producing baccalaureate institutions nationally. OUTSTANDING RESEARCH: There aren't a lot of places in the world where one can hear the topics of Andy Warhol, pirates, and second-harmonic generation microscopy being broached in the same conversation.
