Hi Guys!

Wabash College earned the top spot for three degree programs—Classics, German, and History—in the 2021 College Factual rankings, and three more programs are in the top 1% among U.S. colleges and universities. Wabash received a No. 1 ranking in "Best Value Colleges for History," "Most Focused on Classical Languages and Literature," and "Most Focused on Germanic Languages." Here's a link to the story:

Also, professors Laura Wysocki (Chemistry) and Sara Drury (Rhetoric) will lead a \$600,000 grant from the National Science Foundation (NSF) to study the impacts of deliberation on undergraduate STEM education. The effort, titled "Developing Deliberative Pedagogy for Use in Chemistry Classrooms" will include researchers from Colorado State University, Gustavus Adolphus, and St. Louis Community College.

**SPRING SEMESTER AND BEYOND** – Spring semester classes will begin January 25, and the college will have some staggered "reading days" in the semester instead of a full spring break. The NCAC has canceled conference championships for winter sports, though the Athletic Department is looking at competition with conference and nonconference schools that share the same commitment to daily symptom monitoring, testing, contract tracing, and quarantine as Wabash.

Commencement is scheduled for May 16. The 2021 "Big Bash" dates will be June 4-5-6.

**FINAL THOUGHT** --- In recent years Wabash Magazine has had a small feature called "The W Factor," tidbits of advice about what being a Wabash man means. One of the terrific Wabash men I reconnected with near the end of his life was our president, Dr. Thaddeus Seymour. Dad Thad Seymour died in fall 2019 at the age of 91. His obituaries defined him as someone known for his volunteerism and his commitment to community. Dr. Seymour and his wife co-founded the Winter Park-Maitland (FL) chapter of Habitat for Humanity in 1990, and he served as chairman on the board of directors. This Habitat chapter built more than 50 homes during Dr. Seymour's tenure on the board.
