

Dear Classmates,

Have to begin this letter with some sad news. **Joseph O'Rourke**, **Jr.**, who taught speech and debate at Wabash for 37 years, died at the end of August at age 93. Affectionately nicknamed "Papa Joe" by his adoring students, O'Rourke joined the Wabash faculty in 1960 and taught continuously until his retirement in 1997. Together with Vic Powell, they produced generations of articulate communicators and brilliant lawyers, as well as state and national debate champs. O'Rourke chaired the Speech Department (now Rhetoric) for 20 years.



Joe was a proud native of Missouri and received his bachelor's, master's, and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Missouri. Long-time *Wabash Magazine* Editor Steve Charles captured that impact perfectly in his <u>coverage of Joe's retirement ceremony</u>. KUDOS TO US – The college's annual giving campaign for 2020-2021 was nothing short of amazing. In a year when alumni were unable to even visit campus due to Covid-19, Wabash had 43% of its alumni supporting it through gifts. The Class of '77 is one of the leaders. We had 71 percent of our class making a contribution to Alma Mater last year, the exact same percentage that we had the year before. Our class ranked No. 2 in our "decade cohort" with only the Class of 1971 (celebrating its 50th anniversary) have a greater giving percentage. Even more spectacular IMHO is that fact that our five-year average percentage of alumni giving is 75%, and that's the highest among every class between 1970 and 1982. While I'm not the "money man" in our Class Agent Group (Herm is much better), there is a lot of loyalty and commitment to Wabash behind these terrific numbers. So I'll be on the "watch list" for quite some time now, but as I type this class letter I'm cancer free. Right now I'm classified as a "stage three double survivor" medically speaking.
