But the fundamental goal of this campaign — the thing we simply must do — is to grow our \$320 million endowment substantially between now and our 200th anniversary in 2032. Our task — and our responsibility — is clear. We must do better for Wabash men. We must do better for our College. This is our goal and we will take Giant Steps necessary to achieve it."
