My description of the stadium and my photos below are inadequate to capture what the stadium is like. There is a single set of stands (no more stands on the visitor's side) that rises



much higher than the old stands. On top of the stadium there are now some suites in addition to dedicated rooms for radio, the coaching staffs and other services. There is a great aerial view of Fischer Field (the soccer field).

The incredible transformation of campus that has taken place in the 40 years since we graduated is due in part to your steadfast support and generosity. Wabash was there for us because of the generosity of generations before. Wabash is
