All in all, it wasn't our best effort, but it wasn't our worst, either. With 35 years out now, we should be hitting our stride and being very consistent from year to year. Out of the 195 total on our roles, 70 gave for a 35.9% giving participation rate. Last year, we had 78 give for 40.0% and we had targeted 79 for this year, so we fell 9 short. In all funds, our giving

totaled \$72,708.06. That is about average for classes in our timeframe who are not undertaking large fundraising goals.

For the College, here are the overall results and highlights:

- 5,283 alumni, parents, and friends made gifts to the Annual Fund for \$3,129,507.
- 4,908 alumni made gifts to the College (both Annual Fund and restricted gifts). This total is a *new record for the number of alumni donors in a single year* and is 231 more alumni donors than last year. This was the sixth consecutive year for the College to realize an increase in the number of alumni donors.
- Alumni participation was at 42.4%, which is up from 41.0% last year and 40.2% in FY14.
- There were 34 classes in FY16 that finished ahead of FY15 in alumni donors with an increase of at least one or more alumni donors. (We were not one of these, sadly.)
- Of the top 10 classes in terms of alumni participation, seven were at 50% or more alumni participation. There were 17 classes above the College's alumni participation rate of 42.4%.
- Added together, the 15 most recent graduating classes were at 35.1% participation. This is an outstanding performance for younger alumni, as the 15 most recent classes were at 31.4% last year.
- Eight of the 10 Big Bash reunion classes were at or above the number of alumni donors they had in FY15. (Again, sadly, this was not true for the Class of 1981.)
- Celebrating their 50-year reunion, the Class of 1966 had the highest number of alumni donors (138) and the highest alumni giving percentage (75%) of any class.
- The Class of 2015 made a statement in their first year away from Wabash. The Class of 2015 had the second highest number of alumni donors of any class with 108 alumni making a gift. Not far behind, the Class of 2004 had 104 alumni make a gift for FY16.
- The Class of 2004 led all classes on the day of giving *for a third year in a row* with 84 classmates participating on the day. They also finished FY16 with the highest giving percentage (52.3%) of any class all the way back to 1967 (56.36%), 1965 (52.9%), and 1962 (51%).
- Every class since 1949 had at least one donor on the 4.27 Day of Giving and every class from 1959-2019 had 10 or more alumni make a gift on the day.
- 601 current students in the classes of 2016-2020 made gifts to the College in FY16. This is up 50 from the similar cohort in FY15. Much of this increase can be attributed to the on-campus events that were part of the 4.27 Day of Giving.
- Class of 2016—72% of the Class of 2016 participated in the senior gift campaign with 139 men in the Class of 2016 making a gift to the College in FY16.
