In other news, Wabash College continues to make big headlines in the NCAA Sports world:

- Sophomore, Jack Davidson, recently set the NCAA record for consecutive free throws. Davidson had already surpassed the Division III record of 84 and the Division I record of 85 consecutive free throws earlier in the season and continued on to successfully make 95 straight from the line. The previous record was 94, which had been held by a Division II player.
- The wrestling team recently sent 6 athletes to the National tournament. Wabash came out with 3 All-Americans and yet another national champion. Senior Darden Schurg won the title at 174 pounds, Sophomore Kyle Hatch placed 6<sup>th</sup> at 165 pounds, Freshman Carlos Champagne placed 7<sup>th</sup> at 125 pounds, and the team finished in 9<sup>th</sup> place overall.
- Freshman Preston Whaley placed 7<sup>th</sup> in the Triple Jump competition to claim All-American honors at the Track & Field National competition. Whaley broke his

own school record with a leap of 46 feet 10 inches (14.55 meters)!

• And of course, Wabash defeated DePauw 24-17 back in November to retain the Monon Bell for another year. I know that's not breaking news, but it is always fun to mention.

## **GIANT STEPS: A CAMPAIGN FOR WABASH COLLEGE**

Wabash College has announced the largest fund-raising campaign of our 186-year history seeking to raise \$225 million by our 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2032. The campaign is off to a great start with Paul Woolls '75 and his wife Betty O'Shaghnessy Woolls donating \$40 million, the largest gift ever given to Wabash.

As usual, the school is offering up a donor challenge for our class that could result in an OPEN BAR for our Class Reception Dinner at Big Bash. The goal is to get 5 more donors than our previous high over the last five years, which means we would love to have 89 donors on the books by the time the Big Bash Registration closes on May 22.
