2. Wabash news:

a) The college held a joint **in-person** Commencement for the classes of 2020 and 2021 on May 15 at the newly redesigned Little Giant Stadium. One hundred seventy-eight men of the Class of 2021 received diplomas from President Scott E. Feller and 98 members of the Class of 2020 returned for their chance to cross the stage as well. Additionally, honorary doctorates were awarded to Emeritus Professor of Political Science **Melissa Ann Butler H'85** and Dr. Gregory D. Hess H'19, who served as the 16th President of Wabash. The Class of 2021 included **Greg Zorich**'s son Adam. "Little **Z**" graduated Magna Cum Laude in Religion and had been a defensive back on the football team.

b) One more note about the Classes of 2020 and 2021:

Wabash College graduates have claimed their first destinations following graduation at rates well above the national average. By their graduation, 82.6% of the members of the Class of 2021 have settled into a first destination—employment, graduate school, or service. Six months after graduation, 97.6% of the members of the Class of 2020 were settled into a first destination. The current national average at six-months after graduation is 59%.

- c) The Princeton Review continues to spread the fame of Wabash's honored name. Wabash is included in the Princeton Review's 2021 list of the *Best Value Colleges*.
