- 5. Scarlet Honors Weekend returned on December 10-11 with more than 200 high school seniors and their families attending and 115 staying overnight. Admissions applications are running 14%

ahead of last year. Domestic applications are up 10% from 15 states. Indiana is up 12% in applications from its highest total in the last 5 years. And domestic applications from students of color represent 35.8% of the pool (a 5-year high). <u>https://www.wabash.edu/news/story/11849</u>
