Our Challenge. Many of us received scholarships and financial aid from the College when we were there. The impact of the downturn in the economy is still being felt by our Alma Mater. I know we all face a lot of expenses but here's a thought. For the price of foregoing one adult beverage per month (\$5), you could make an annual gift to Wabash for \$60. For the price of two of those, the gift would be \$120.00. Who would miss that amount every month? No one, I'll bet. You can go on line and have Wabash debit your credit card each month for the gift. (<https://www.wabash.edu/alumni/egift>). Many of you will ask yourselves what difference your gift will make? Look at it from this perspective. In Indiana, for a Wabash license plate, the BMV charges \$25.00 extra dollars and then sends that money to Wabash as a gift from the plate owner. \$25 – not much by itself, you might think. However, last year, from the license plates alone, Wabash received over \$27,000. That's enough for 10 students to go on an immersion trip. That's enough for 10 paid summer internships. There is power in our numbers and all it takes is for us to make a gift. Over 90% of us received financial help from Wabash and last year 26.7% of us made a gift. We can do better.

Cain is one of 10 inducted into the Athletics Hall of Fame. On the eve of this year's Monon Bell Game the College held its bi-annual Athletics Hall of Fame Induction and All-American Swimmer Jason Cain has joined classmates Kent Baker, Mike Crnkovich, Bill Kepler, and Eric Verduin as Hall of Famers.



A native of Portage, Indiana, Cain was a highly decorated swimmer who was part of teams that posted a 37-0 dual meet record and won 16 major invitational titles during his career. Individually, he was a four-year letterman, two-time captain, and helped Wabash to four straight top-20 finishes at the national championships. As a senior, he was the high point swimmer at the Liberal Arts Invitational; won Most Valuable Swimmer honors for Wabash and the Indiana Collegiate Athletic Conference; and captained the team that placed eighth at the NCAAs. By graduation, he was a five-time All-American, seven-time Honorable Mention All-American, and was a three-time Scholar All-American. He helped break 19 school records, five of which still stand.
