The 183rd Commencement, celebrating the Classes of 2020 and 2021, was held on Saturday, May 15, 2021 in the new Little Giant Stadium. 178 men from the Class of 2021 received their diplomas, and 98 men from the Class of 2020 were in attendance to receive recognition of their achievements.
