Giving Back

Last year our class did really well! Our class ranked **#14** with **80 total donors**. The Class of 1966 was first with 138 donors and the Class of 2003 rounded out the top 15 with 79 total donors. The range for the Top 15 in giving percentage was 43% to 75%. Our class was calculated at 39.2% (80/204). This is awesome! Further, our class surpassed its number of donors goal by **15** people!

As we move into 2017, Mike and I would like for all of you to consider 2 things regarding giving this year:

- 1) Mark your calendars for the Wabash Day of Giving when we e-mail you with the date. The Day of Giving has been so successful the past few years that we expect for it to continue. - 2) While many of you prefer to wait for an e-mail or a phone call from me or Mike, we would like for you to consider contributing to Wabash by setting up a recurring gift when you make your next donation. Mike and I both have this set up and its budget friendly and convenient. The *site* will allow you to set up a recurring gift that you can customize by amount, how often a gift is made, and on what day of the month. My reoccurring gift is set up to kick in before the end of the calendar year (taxes) and at the beginning of the college's fiscal year (honor roll).
