2017-2018 Fiscal Year: Class of 2005 Giving Review

Long story short, we rocked Wabash's 4.18 Day of Giving! Because we came together for #OurWabash, over 3,700 people made 5,100 gifts totaling more than \$1 Million for Wabash and the Class of 2005 challenge was a success. Here are the statistics for our class:

- Before this year, our highest number of donors on the College's Annual Day of Giving was 64 donors
- Last year we had 53 donors
- Our rank last year was #8 of all classes
- Our goal this year was 75 donors
- We met our goal with exactly 75 donors!
- Our class made 113 gifts on 4.18, totaling \$6,764.18 (please note that this number is not representative of or any indication of where those funds were allocated)
- Our rank this year was #3 of ALL classes

ATHLETICS

The 2017-18 season concluded on a high note as the baseball team advanced to the NCAA Mid-East Regional final and set a new record for most wins in one season (37).

RaShawn Jones '20 earned All-American honors with a fifth-place finish in the 110m hurdles, while the tennis doubles team of William Reifeis and Patrick McAuley also achieved All-American distinction, advancing to the NCAA national semifinals.

The 2018-19 season is already fast approaching. The football team reports for preseason camp on Aug. 8, and the first home football game is Sept. 8 vs. Wisconsin-Stevens Point.

Preparations for the 125th Monon Bell game are already underway; we host this year's contest on Nov. 10 and plan to retain the Bell for the ninth time in the past decade.

"I'm living in Palmhurst, Texas and I have a 4-mile commute, along with my wife having a 4-mile commute to Sharyland Pioneer.

This year has been challenging as I have gone back for another fellowship to further develop myself as a true instructional leader. I've been a part of the Relay GSE (Graduate School for Education) Principal's Fellowship program and it's felt like another post-graduate degree. I do it because I want to provide a top quality education to our students in Mission, along with giving our kids access to a strong athletic program. Too often I see schools giving up athletics for academics or vice versa as I'm sure you can understand.

I lead a 6 – 8 middle school for a top performing charter network and our founding 8th grade class will matriculate in to our High School next year to start our 9th grade. I'm excited because our kids are proving what IS possible! We have 8th grade students taking 3 high school courses that require students to pass the state exam in order to graduate High School in the state of Texas. At least 30 of our students will enter high school with Algebra 1, Algebra 2 & Biology courses out of the way. The entire class, 125, will have Algebra 1 and Biology out of the way. This is HUGE! This will free up time for them to take IB exams and AP exams for college credit and it will allow our kids to be exposed to true college material prior to being in college. My ideal situation is to have our students authentically experience the rigors of college throughout their junior and senior years to help set them up for success at the college of their choice. Our network has had 100% of our seniors accepted to a 4-year university for the past 11 years and I expect our founding class to be no different.

Thanks for asking and being excited about the work I'm doing in the Valley! It's quite an honor though! Every day I go to work, I'm reminded of Jeff Espino, friend and teammate on the basketball team, and the fight he had with cancer my freshman year at Wabash. The fight he had and the joy he brought the basketball team my sophomore year comes up every day I drive past the school Jeff works at while I am on the way to my campus.

I am currently on a trip touring colleges with 12 - 8th grade students, too. We flew to DC on Sunday and it's been an amazing experience for my kids already. We have seen some great places in DC, including Arlington Cemetery, a couple Smithsonian museums, Georgetown, George Washington, American University, UVA, U of Richmond and we will be heading to Elon Univ., Duke, UNC, etc. in the next two days."
