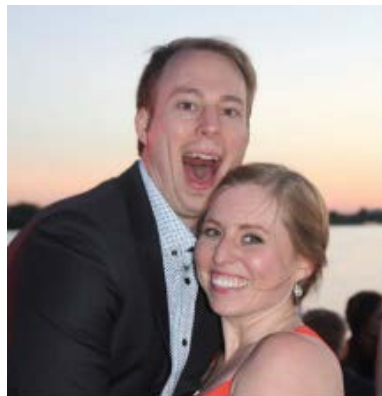

The Little Giants struggled on offense throughout the game, but succeeded on a gutsy play call when it counted with a two point conversion in the fourth quarter to go up 22-21. The football team completed an “official” capture of the coveted Bell weeks after a failed heist attempt by four Wabash students disguised in Donald Trump and Barack Obama masks had made national headlines.



Wabash Basketball opened conference play by defeating perennial conference leader and #25 ranked College of Wooster at Wooster 85-72. Sophomores Alex Eberhard (Evansville, IN) and Harrison Hallstrom (Naperville, IL) led the way in scoring along with Freshman Jack Davidson (Fishers, IN).
