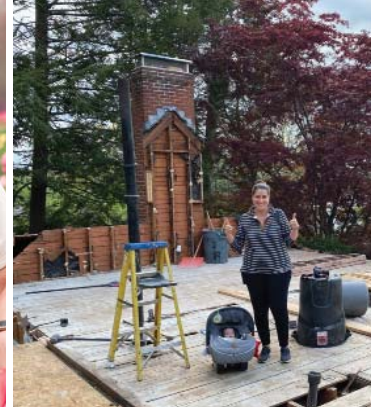


CLASSMATE UPDATES

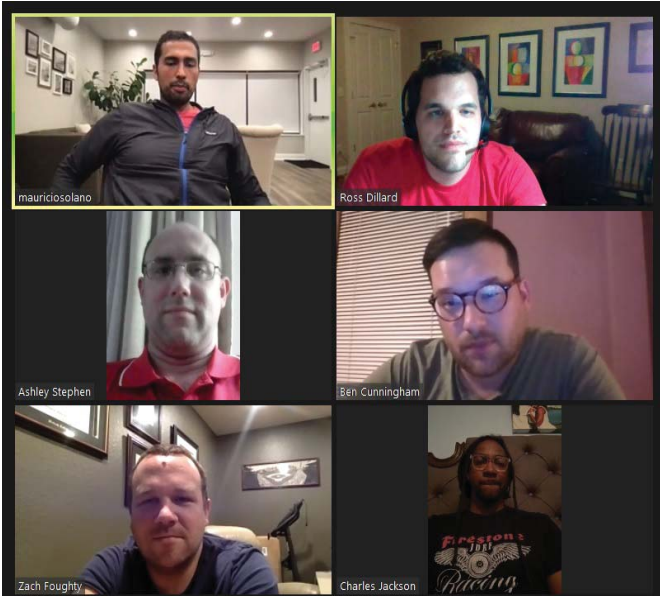
