The students and faculty are already past midsemester, the semester ending with exams the week of Thanksgiving (with no classes or exams during the month of December). Classes will resume in January after the seniors take Comprehensive Exams. **Dr. David Blix '70** is teaching courses in Pioneer Chapel while **Dr. Eric Wetzel** is teaching courses in Knowling Fieldhouse. Center Hall staircases have become one-way, and building entrances are designated exit or entry only. On last check, 10% of students are tested for COVID-19 at any given time.

Many college staff who don't have direct student-facing roles are working from home or splitting time.
