Rudy here. Well, they did it. Wabash College now has a full academic year under its belt with having to contend with the COVID-19 pandemic. In his final community letter of the academic year, President Scott Feller reminded readers that, "This year has been challenging and all of us have experienced moments of frustration and a sense of loss. But we have carried out our mission of educating young men to think critically, act responsibly, lead effectively, and live humanely in a difficult world. Hopefully we have all learned something about ourselves and our capacity for resilience. We have certainly learned important lessons about what we can do as a community when we are #WabashTogether."



The College was able to hold an in-person commencement ceremony on Saturday, May 15, providing an opportunity to pay tribute to the classes of 2020 and 2021. Dr. Melissa Butler H'85 and former president Greg Hess received honorary degrees. After nearly fifteen months of campus not being open to visitors, the administration is opening campus for



part of Saturday, June 5 for Big Bash Weekend from 10am to 2pm. A free food truck lunch will be provided from 11am to 2pm. Alumni and Parent Relations staff will be located under a tent/canopy on the mall for sign-in, and campus will be open rain or shine. Masks will be required. As a reminder, *anyone* is welcome to attend Big Bash Weekend. Stay tuned for more information as we get closer to our decade-mark reunion weekend in June 2023.

In March, Wabash Theatre put on a marvelous, spooky production of *Twisted Tales of Poe*, set as a radio drama. The show was performed live and streamed during each performance, accessible on the College's website. Directed by Associate Professor of Theater Jim Cherry, the production was dramatization of some of Poe's most well-known and frightening stories, The Tell-Tale Heart,' The Cask of Amontillado,' The Raven,' and 'Hop-Frog.' It was written by Philip Grecian, with additional material by John K. Reshetar.



The eighth Annual Day of Giving on April 8 was another smashing success. Wabash College celebrated its best single day fundraising effort in history. The College received more than 5,800 gifts totaling over \$1.34 million. It was still short of 45% of alumni giving, a mark many of us believe to still be achievable. The **Giant Steps** campaign has reached \$200 million raised.

Homecoming is set for Saturday, September 18, the home opener for the football team and the brand-new stadium against the Allegheny College Alligators. The Monon Bell Classic was canceled last year and had been slated to be played this year at Wabash on Saturday, November 13.
