(1) An Acknowledgement that the institution signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used the applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSAA and ARP(a)(1) and (a)(4) programs to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

Wabash College signed and returned the Certification and Agreement (CFDA 84.425E) (a) on 3/30/2021. The institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) and (c) of division B of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) (Pub.L. 116-136). The amount of funds made available by this award under CFDA 84.425E represents the minimum amount the Recipient must use for financial aid grants to students.

(2) The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs:

Wabash College has been awarded a cumulative amount of \$1,866,916 for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA (HEERF I & II) and ARP (HEERF III) programs under (a)(1) and (a)(4).

(3) The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs as of the date of submission (ie., as of the initial report and every calendar quarter thereafter).

Wabash College distributed \$744,262.53, during the current quarter, for Emergency Financial Aid grants to Students, for a cumulative total of \$1,866,916.

(4) The estimated total number of students at the institution that are eligible to receive

Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA (HEERF I & II) and ARP (HEERF III) (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

Based upon current federal eligibility requirements, 1,301 students are eligible to receive CRSSA and ARP Emergency Financial Aid Grants for Students. Any student who was enrolled on March 13, 2020 or after is considered eligible for the emergency funding. This includes students who withdrew and/or graduated.

(5) The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

The total number of unique students who have received CRRSAA and ARP funds to date is 766.

(6) The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

For CRSSA (HEERF I & II), Wabash College's Institutional Research staff provided the data needed to identify Federal Pell Grant Recipients. The Financial Aid Office staff identified students who had substantial need. Customized e-mail messages were sent to these students, with a link to an application for funding. For ARP, funds were granted to students who were enrolled on or after March 13, 2020, who wished to clear outstanding balances and to students whose need increased due to Covid-19-related issues. At the beginning of the spring 2022 semester, the College emailed all students a link to the application to request additional Covid-19 relief funding. Once the application process was exhausted, the Financial Aid Office identified students with extraordinary need to receive a final block grant distribution.

(7) Any instructions, directions, or guidance provided by the institution to students concerning the Emergency Grant
