

Wabash College CRRSA Act Grant (HEERF II) Initial

January 1, 2021 - March 31, 2021

Wabash College signed and returned the Certification and Agreement (CFDA 84.425E) ((a) on 3/30/2021. The institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) and (c) of division B of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) (Pub. L. 116-136). The amount of funds made available by this award under CFDA 84.425E represents the minimum amount that Recipient must use for financial aid grants to students.

(2) The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

Wabash College has received \$405,462 for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA under (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

(3) The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs as of the date of submission (*i.e.*, as of the initial report and every calendar quarter thereafter).

Wabash College distributed \$290,200 on 2/24/2021 for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students, for a total of \$290,200.

(4) The estimated total number of students at the institution that are eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

Wabash has approximately 750 students with Pell Grants and others with substantial financial need who meet the eligibility requirements to receive Emergency Financial Aid Student Grants.

(5) The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

A total of 578 students have received CRRSA (HEERF II) Emergency Financial Aid Grants as of this report date.

(6) The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive EmergencyFinancial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

Wabash College's Institutional Research staff provided the data needed for student Federal Pell Grant Recipients and other Wabash students who met the eligibility requirements. Customized e-mail messages were sent to Federal Pell Grant Recipients and to other eligible students regarding these Emergency Financial Aid Grants.

(7) Any instructions, directions, or guidance provided by the institution to students concerning the Emergency Financial Aid Grants.
