The Montgomery County Health Department does an amazing job and is just a few blocks north of campus. All of the retail pharmacies in Montgomery County also offer COVID vaccine, including Walgreens, Walmart, CVS, and Kroger.

You do not need an appointment for the vaccine, but you may have a more efficient experience if you do make one.

Do not delay—the COVID-19 situation is dire now, with hospitals full and younger people are increasingly being infected and hospitalized due to variants, particularly Delta, that have become predominant.

And remember, one is not considered fully-vaccinated until 14 days after the second dose. Many people become infected before their two weeks are up, thinking they are protected immediately after their second shot. Fourteen days after your second dose, you will not need to participate in routine surveillance testing or the Wabash COVID app daily monitoring.
