

Welcome to the Wabash Student Health Portal

Dear Student,

Please excuse length of this email, but it contains essential information regarding how Wabash will collect your health information in preparation for the coming academic year. Wabash utilizes PyraMED, an electronic health records system. This software enables the College to streamline collection of medical information to be used by the Student Health Center staff. It will also be used by Dean Thrush for those requesting academic and/or physical accommodations.

Your interactions with PyraMED will be through the <u>Student Health Portal</u>. You should bookmark this site. A link is also be posted on the MyBash and Student Health Center web pages. You may log into the Portal on a computer or mobile device using your Wabash network username and password starting June 9, 2025.

Since the Portal will allow access to your sensitive protected health information including Student Health Center clinical notes, labs, and other test results, it is **critical that you do not share your network logon credentials with anyone, including your parents**, unless you want them to have full access. If you have already shared your credentials with others, <u>you can change your password here</u>.

A WALK-THROUGH OF THE STUDENT HEALTH PORTAL

You will see a number of tabs at the top in the scarlet banner that are generally self-explanatory, but here's a description of each:

<u>Home</u>

You may see reminders at the top of the page that indicate you are non-compliant with immunizations or have "forms" pending completion (see "MyForms" below) – DO NOT IGNORE THEM

My Profile

This is where you will have access to your health records for your information and to share with other health providers as needed.

Messages

This section will be used to send secure messages back-and-forth between the students and staff members who are using PyraMED. **This is how you will communicate with the Student Health Center (SHC).** This provides privacy for you and ensures that messages will be seen by SHC staff who are on duty when you send a message.

The messaging function is where you will contact the SHC to request an appointment using "New Message," and will be how the SHC contacts you about appointments, results, etc. using "View Messages." When we send you a secure message, you will receive a notification via your Wabash



Outlook email AND a text message to the cell phone number on file with the College. It is therefore **critical that the College has the correct cell number for YOUR personal cell phone** (not your parent's or someone else's). There will be a form available in your "MyForms" for you to confirm your cell number. If you want to opt out of receiving text messages notifying you that you have a secure message waiting on the Portal, contact us using the email link at the top right of the Portal Home page.

MyForms

This is where all the forms you need to complete will reside. **You must complete all the forms in this section of the Portal <u>no later than July 15</u>**. WLAIP students must complete this prior to arriving on campus July 2. This will allow College staff time to act on the information prior the start of the fall semester. Some of the forms require you to attach written documentation. To do this, you will either need to save a scan of the document on your computer or phone or take a photo of the document and store it on your phone. Once those files are on your device, you can choose them within the form for upload. It is very important that the scans or photos you upload are <u>legible</u> (e.g., not an insurance card you have had in your wallet where the printing has become smudged). Some of the forms also require a signature indicating you have read/agree to the material. Simply type your name to indicate you are signing these forms.

Appointments

This is where you will be able to see your upcoming appointments in the Student Health Center. You will receive a reminder text message and email at 8 a.m. on the day of a scheduled appointment.
